1. Please have this form completed & signed by a licensed veterinarian.
2. Please print two to three copies for each horse, one for CSI and one for your records (or your vet's records, if he wants to keep one on file).
3. There is no charge for submitting this form for you horse but the horse **must** be at least 3 years of age.
4. If you have submitted this form earlier but would like to make a correction on record for changes in the statistics (such as height, cannon measurement, heart girth) please resubmit the form signed by a vet recording the changes for CSI records. The genetic questions may be omitted if the form was submitted at an earlier date.
5. **Cannon bone measurement** is the circumference of the cannon bone just below the knee joint and reported in inches. (See C below).
6. Height should be reported in hands (ie 15 hands and 2 inches – 15.2. Half inches may be reported. Measurement should be taken on level ground preferably a level, paved area, for accurate results. Measurement should be done with a measuring stick, not a tape, for more accurate results.
